- A child with an Autism Spectrum Disorder is born in Tarrant County every day.

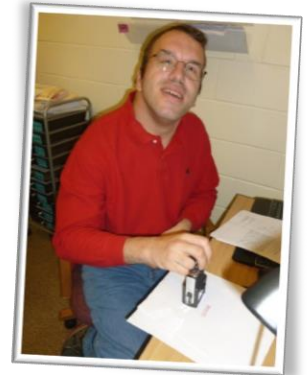
## About IDD Council of Tarrant County

## About IDD

IDD is used to describe any life-long disability attributable to mental and/or physical impairments that are diagnosed before the age of 18 (intellectual disabilities) or age 22 (developmental disabilities). IDD affect daily functioning in two or more of the following areas: capacity for independent living, economic self-sufficiency, learning, mobility, receptive and expressive language, self-care and self-direction. IDD includes such diagnoses as Autism Spectrum Disorder, Cerebral Palsy and Down Syndrome. Individuals can have symptoms that range from mild to severe.
